



Idioms in English - Phrasal Verbs

Idioms like "bank on something" and "measure up" are used frequently in conversations, email, and presentations in English. When nonnative speakers of English don't understand the idioms, they can miss the point of a conversation, email, or presentation since the idiom is often used to encapsulate the message.

This is a self-paced course. Students should review the course syllabus before enrolling. Each student will have up to 12 months to complete the course and meet the course objectives as outlined below.

Electronic textbooks for the course - *Idioms in English – Phrasal Verbs*

Idioms in English – Phrasal Verbs was first released in 2016.
